Exchequer Considers VAT Imposition on Fares...

The Chancellor, reportedly, is considering imposing Value-Added Tax (VAT) on taxi and private hire fares. This coincides with the now-closed HMRC 'Consultation on the VAT Treatment of Private Hire Vehicles' from 2024 (on which a Government response is still awaited) and the Supreme Court decision in DELTA Merseyside Ltd et al v Uber Britannia Ltd [2025] UKSC 31.
